Past performance

MSI/TetraTech (Agency: USAID) (2021-2026): As a subcontractor to MSI/TetraTech on the Venezuela Monitoring and Evaluation Project (VMEP) for USAID BHA, i-APS maintains a Venezuela country office and manages all personnel and logistics to conduct up to 100 site visits per year. As of Oct. 2023, i-APS has conducted over 170 site visits, with zero security incidents and data quality at over 99%. i-APS has trained over 30 Venezuelan nationals using its training platform **KAP**_{course}.

Humanitarian Assistance Evidence Cycle (Agency: USAID) (2023-2024): As part of a USAID-funded award to increase the effectiveness of emergency food security activities funded by USAID BHA, i-APS is implementing an impact evaluation of sorghum, a climate sensitive crop, in Honduras, in coordination with ADRA Honduras.

IDEAL Small Grants (Agency: USAID) (2022-2023): As part of a USAID-funded small grant, i-APS piloted an innovative qualitative monitoring and research method call Photovoice, focusing on two complex settings: Venezuela and Syria. Produced a learning brief and training materials that USAID BHA has shared globally.

World Food Programme (WFP) IDIQ (2021-2026): As an IDIQ holder for global evaluations for WFP, i-APS has been awarded 4 performance evaluations to date: Turkey, Egypt, Cambodia (midline and endline) and Uganda.

UNOCHA IDIQ (2021-2024): i-APS conducts third-party monitoring of UNOCHA cross-border Syria and Turkey humanitarian assistance, coordinating with over 70 implementing partners and over 120 programs per year. Designs tools, conducts primary data collection and drafts reports averaging over 50 a quarter.

ACTED (Donor: European Union) (2022-2023): Funded by the European Union, designed and managed capacity building and small grants program to Middle East and North Africa local organizations as part of their localization agenda.

Norwegian Refugee Council (2023): i-APS is designing and adapting its **KAP**_{org} technology product to produce a verified database of Ukraine based vendors in support of humanitarian assistance responding to the current war.
